Description

In Year 10, continue a studying Indonesian from year 9. The course will be organised in such a way as to cater for the varied needs and skills of all students in the group. Students who are considering taking LOTE at VCE level are expected to take this elective in both Semester 1 and Semester 2. To offer an enjoyable experience of the culture of another country through a study of its language and lifestyle. Students will be encouraged to use the L.O.T.E. in a variety of everyday situations and at the same time to develop greater understanding of English. Students may also have the opportunity to travel to Indonesia.

Unit Topics

The key features of the L.O.T.E. program are the use of everyday language in an activity-based course. The following topics will be included: family, friends, school, leisure, letter writing, food, shopping, a diary and travel.

Skill Development

Students learn the macro skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening in a variety of ways.
